## Chapter 9

The people repenting in fafting and fackcloth, put away their wives of ftrange nations. 5. Efdras confeffeth Gods benefites, and the peoples ingratitude, 32. prayeth for them, and maketh league with God.

nd in the foure and twenteth day of the moneth the children of Ifrael came together in fafting and facke-clothes, and earth vpon them. <sup>2</sup> And the feede of the children of Ifrael was <sup>a</sup>)feperated from euerie ftrange childe: and they ftood, and confeffed their finnes, and the iniquities of their fathers. <sup>3</sup> And they role vp to ftand: and they read in the volume of the law of our Lord their God, four times in a day, and foure times they confeffed, and adored our Lord their God. <sup>4</sup> And there arofe vpon the fteppe of the Leuites Iofue, and Bani, Cedmihel, Sabania, Bonni, Sarebias, Bani, and Chanani: and they cried with a lowde voice to our Lord their God. <sup>5</sup> And the Leuites Iofue and Cedmihel, Bonni, Hafebnia, Serebia, Odaia, Sebnia, and Phathahia, faid: Arife. Bleffe our Lord your God from eternitie to eternitie: and let them bleffe the high name of thy glorie in al bleffing & praife. <sup>6</sup> Thou the fame ô Lord, alone thou haft made heauen, & al the hoft thereof: the earth & al thinges that are in it: the feas and al thinges that are therin: and thou doft give life to al thefe thinges, and the hoft of heauẽ adoreth thee. <sup>7</sup> Thou the fame ô Lord God, which didft choofe Abram, & broughteft him out of the fire of the Chaldees, and gaueft him the <sup>b</sup>)name Abraham. <sup>8</sup> And thou didft finde his hart faithful before thee: and thou madeft a couenante with him, that thou would ft geue him the land of the Chananite, of the Hetheite, and of the Amorrheite, and of the Pherezeite, and of the Iebufeite, & of the Gergefeite,

to geue vnto his feede: and thou haft fulfilled thy wordes, becaufe thou art iuft. <sup>9</sup> And thou faweft the affliction of our fathers in Ægypt: & their crie thou didft heare vpon the Read fea. <sup>10</sup> And thou gaueft fignes & wonders in Pharao, and in all his feruants, and in all the people of his land: for thou didft know that they had done proudly againft them: and thou madeft thyfelf a name, as alfo at this day. <sup>11</sup> And thou didft diuide the fea before them, and they paffed through the midft of the fea in drie land: but their perfecutors thou threweft into the depth, as a ftone into the rough waters. <sup>12</sup> And in a piller of a cloude thou waft their leader by day, and in a piller of fire by night, that the way might appeare to them, by the which they went. <sup>13</sup> To mount Sinai alfo thou didft defcend, and fpakeft with them from heaven, and thou gaueft them right iudgements, and the law of truth, ceremonies, and good preceptes. <sup>14</sup> Thy fanctified Sabbath thou didft fhew them, and the commandements, and ceremonies, and the law thou didft command them in the hand of Moyfes thy feruant. <sup>15</sup> Bread alfo from heauen thou gaueft them in their hunger, and water out of the rocke thou didft bring forth to them thirfting, and thou faideft to them that they fhould enter in, and poffeffe the land, vpon which thou didft lift vp thy hand to diliver it them. <sup>16</sup> But they and our fathers did proudly, and hardned their neckes and heard not thy comandements. <sup>17</sup> And they <sup>a</sup>)would not heare, and they remembred not thy merueylous workes which thou haft done to them.

Num. 17. And they hardned their neckes, and gaue the head to returne to their feruitude, as it were by contention. But thou a propitious God, and gratious, and merciful, long fuffering and of much compaffion, didft not forfake them.
<sup>18</sup> Yea and when they had made to them felues a molten calfe, and had faid: This is thy god, which brought thee out of Ægypt: and they did great blafphemies. <sup>19</sup> But thou in thy manie mercies didft not leaue them in the defert: the piller of the cloude departed not from them by day to lead them into the way, and the piller of fire by

night to flew them the way by which they floud goe. <sup>20</sup> And thou gaueft them thy good fpirite, which fhould teach them, and thy Manna thou didft not withhold from their mouth, and thou gaueft them water in thirft. <sup>21</sup> Fourtie yeares didft thou feede them in the defert, and nothing was wanting to them, their garmentes waxed not old, and their feete not worne. <sup>22</sup> And thou gaueft them kingdomes, and peoples, and didft part lottes vnto them: and they poffeffed the land of Sehon, and the land of the king Hefebon, and the land of Og the king of Bafan. <sup>23</sup> And thou didft multiplie their children as the ftarres of heauen, & brought them to the land wherof thou hadft faid to their fathers, that they floud enter and poffeffe <sup>24</sup> And the children came, and poffeffed the land, it. and thou didft humble before them the inhabiters of the land, the Chananeites, and gaueft them into their hand, and their kinges, and the peoples of the land, that they might doe to them as it pleafed them. <sup>25</sup> They therfore tooke the fenfed cities and fatte ground, and poffeffed houfes ful of al goodes: cefternes made by others, vineyardes, and oliuetes, & manie trees that bare fruite: and they did eate, and were filled, and became fatte, and abounded with delicious thinges in thy great goodnes. <sup>26</sup> But they prouoked thee to wrath, & departed from thee, and threw thy law behind their backes: & they killed thy prophetes, which admonifhed them erneftly to returne to thee: and they did great blafphemies. <sup>27</sup> And thou gaueft them into the handes of their enemies, and they afflicted them. And in the time of their tribulation they cried to thee, & thou from heaven didft heare, and according to thy manie copaffions gaueft them faulours, that fhould faue them from the hand of their enemies. <sup>28</sup> And when they had refted, they returned to do euil in thy fight: & thou didft leave them in the hand of their enemies, and they poffeffed them. And they returned, & cried to thee: & thou heardeft from heauen, and deliueredft the in thy mercies, manie times. <sup>29</sup> And thou didft admonifh them that they found returne to thy law. But they did proudly, & heard not thy comandmentes, and finned in thy iudgementes, which a man

fhould do, and fhal live in them, and they gave the reuolting fhoulder, and hardned their necke, neither did they heare. <sup>30</sup> And thou didft prolong manie yeares ouer them, and didft teftifie to charge them in thy fpirit by the hand of thy Prophetes: and they heard not, and thou didft deliuer them into the hand of the peoples of the nations. <sup>31</sup> But in thy very many mercies thou madeft them not into confumption, neither didft thou forfake them: becaufe a God of compaffions and gratious art thou. <sup>32</sup> Now therfore O our God, great, ftrong, and terrible, keeping couenant and mercie, turne not away from thy face all the labour, which hath found vs. our Kinges. and our Princes, and our Priefts, and our Prophetes, and our fathers, and all the people from the daies of the king of Affur, vntil this day. <sup>33</sup> And thou art iuft in al thinges, that have come vpon vs: becaufe thou haft done truth, but we have done wickedly. <sup>34</sup> Our Kinges, our Princes, our Prieftes, and our fathers have not done thy law, and have not attended thy commandmentes, and thy teftimonies which thou haft teftified among them. <sup>35</sup> And they in their reignes, and in thy manifold goodnes, which thou gaueft them, and in the land moft large and fatte, which thou didft deliuer in their fight, ferued not thee, nor returned from their moft wicked deuifes. <sup>36</sup> Behold we our felues this day are bondmen: and the land, which thou gaueft our fathers, that they floud eate the bread theref, and the good thinges that are theref, and our felues are feruantes in it. <sup>37</sup> And the fruites thereof are multiplied to the kinges, whom thou haft fette ouer vs for our finnes, and they have dominion ouer our bodies, and ouer our beaftes, according to their wil, and we are in great tribulation. <sup>38</sup> Therfore vpon al thefe thinges we our felues make a couenant, and write, and our Princes, our Leuites, and our Prieftes figne it.
